Phonics and Reading

Here at Evenwood \bar{C} of E Primary School, we follow the Sounds-Write phonics programme .Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 take part in daily phonics sessions where they will learn the skills that are needed to read. Those children in these year groups will take home a reading book that they will be able to read using the skills taught during phonic lessons. We recommend that children read daily at home and reread these books until they become confident, fluent readers.




Help your child to read

Classroom Reads


Bowes Castle Class are reading Ava's Poppy by Marcus Pfister


Raby Castle Class are reading The Lighthouse Keepers Lunch by David Armitage


will they realise just how helpful an octopus can be?




Key Stage 2 The Vanishing Trick by Jenni Spangler
