



Evenwood CofE Primary School Proposed Sport Premium Spending 2021-22



In the 2021/22 academic year we expect to receive £16,830. Plus, the additional money from the academic year 2021-22 (£6761). The total monies available for this academic year is £23,612. The money will be spent to fulfil the following grant conditions:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

Staindrop Sport Partnership	To provide opportunities for all pupils to access competitive sport. Every child will attend a competition or festival and will compete against other children from local schools. Competitions include: tag rugby, hockey, football, cricket, netball and many more. All children with attend sport festivals. During the festivals children will participate in a range of activities.	4, 5 2, 3	£2750
School PE Kit	Purchasing school PE kit throughout the school will allow all of the children to regularly participate in sports and PE. It will allow all children to take part in a number of different sporting activities they would not be able to without the kit.	1, 2, 3, 5	£100

Premier Education	The role Premier Education will provide in the school is, it will give us opportunity to offer a weekly after school club throughout the school that we would not be able to offer due to not having the equipment. PE Resources	Purchasing new PE resources increase the school's opportunity to engage more children in new sports as well as existing sports within school. Forest School staff training	Three members of staff are learning new skills with the Forest Schools training, therefore we will have one member of staff in each class trained to Level 3 standards to lead session. The training will increase staffs confidence, knowledge and skills in outdoor education and outdoor adventurous activities. Throughout the year, all children will be involved in forest schools with an aim to broaden the range of activities and participation. This will also provide new opportunities for further after school clubs, ran by qualified staff.	1,2,3,4	£2450
Opal Play	The OPAL programme would support the schools play improvement and sustainability to improve the quality of play. OPAL provides staff with training and development to develop play literacy while increasing physical activity. This would provide children who are not engaging in sports with the opportunity to still have active playtime and lunchtimes.	1	£4750

Staff training	To increase the skills and knowledge of staff, they will undertake a variety of training to upskill. The PE subject lead will undertake the Level 5 Certificate in PE Specialism which will develop knowledge to lead the subject. Early Years staff will also be given training in Teddy Time which will provide more knowledge for PE lessons and motor skills sessions to increase their confidence teaching PE.
